There are too many things that Jeff as Commander has done to improve Marine Rescue throughout the State to mention here.


Finally, thanks Jeff for everything you have done to improve Marine Rescue Statewide. Bloody legend.

## Australian Government

### Australian Maritime Safety Authority

#### **EXEMPTION 24 UPDATE**

Early October saw AMSA open a consultation period on proposed changes to Exemption 24 - Marine Safety (Emergency service vessels). To read or download the draft document, click <a href="https://exemption.org/nc/here">here</a>.

The key proposed changes include:

- applying consistent competency requirements for volunteer emergency services by broadening the volunteer marine rescue (VMR) allowances to other services such as state emergency services and fire service organisations
- making it easier to share crew between volunteer organisations
- introducing specific training for vessels between 12 and 24 metres in length
- clarifying the permitted activities that can be conducted under the exemption
- reducing the radio competency requirements for operations closer to shore
- removing unnecessary certificate of survey allowances all vessels are required to meet the same domestic commercial vessel (DCV) vessel certification requirements
- removing the exemption application process for other emergency service authorities (AMSA792), with arrangements to be made through the specific exemption (SPEX) process if still required.

The period for consultation ended earlier this month (December) and to the best of our knowledge all Groups had the opportunity to submit their comments.

VMRWA was no different and the one major issue was AMSA's lack of understanding regarding training here in Western Australia, not just what we are doing but the Training Accreditation Council's (TACWA) position on non-accredited training.

We were happy to inform AMSA of where they had a misunderstanding on the matter.

The DFES Trainer / Assessor package is in our opinion extremely good and is "fit for purpose" as they say.

We can now only wait for AMSA's response. Something, this side of Christmas is plainly out of the question and in the new year most probably but when, don't ask hard questions. We will keep everyone up to speed.









# Join the Deckee Trial Making Boating Safer and Easier!

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) and Marine Rescue Western Australia are excited to introduce **Deckee**, a free app designed to make boating safer and more convenient for everyone.

From 17 February to 17 April 2025, we are running a public trial in selected areas to test how Deckee can improve safety on the water.

#### What is Deckee?

- It is a free app for your phone.
- It includes a Log On/Log Off (LOLO) service to keep you safe when heading out on the water. NOTE

   you can download the app now, but the LOLO function will not be available for use until the trial start date 17/2/25
- You will also get access to local weather updates, safety alerts, and more.

#### What is LOLO, and Why Should I Use It?

The Log On/Log Off (LOLO) service is a simple way to let someone know your plans on the water:

- Log On when you head out by sharing details of your trip (such as your destination and return time).
- Log Off once you are back safely. If you do not return on time, Marine Rescue volunteers will follow processes to locate and assist you if required

#### **Using LOLO means:**

- If something unexpected happens, help can reach you faster.
- You will give your family and friends peace of mind knowing someone is keeping track of your safety.
- It's quick, easy, and could save lives.

#### Why Join the Trial?

- Be part of an exciting new way to improve boating safety.
- Help us make sure the app works well for boaters like you.
- It's free and takes only a few moments to use!

#### **Trial Locations:**

If you boat near **Broome, Port Walcott, Onslow, Geraldton, Two Rocks, Whitfords, Rockingham, Walpole, or Denmark**, you are invited to join!

#### How to Get Started:


 Download Deckee from the App Store or Google Play. (The QR code works for both Apple & Android devices – just scan and follow the prompts to install Deckee on your device)




- 2. Use the LOLO service to log your trips during the trial (17<sup>th</sup> February to 17<sup>th</sup> April 2025).
