

The National Volunteer Marine Search and Rescue Committee [NVMSARC] was held in WA in May. This committee (of which VMRWA has a seat) is critical for Volunteer Marine Rescue as it is recognised as the peak body that AMSA recognises nationally.

Those in attendance included the Chair of the NVMSARC, Darryl Wright; Manager of the new Queensland Marine Rescue Service, Mathew Thompson with Ben Penrose with Boyd Griggs – Alex Barrell and Stacey Tannos from Marine Rescue NSW, Graham Kingston and Keith Williams from VMR Queensland; DFESWA's Manager, Marine Services, Mark Eatts, along with VMRWA's Jeff Howe and Dan Goodlad.

Queensland VMR's Gary Voss made a special visit to further inspect M.R. Two Rocks new R.V. Neptune,

NVMSARC is instrumental in placing Volunteer Marine Rescue's interests to AMSA as the national regulator. Exemption 24 [EX 24] is up for discussion and this was the main point of this meeting.

Also discussed was the "Blue Water" planning that is well underway in Queensland to bring the two volunteer services [VMR & AVCG] together under a single banner. It is interesting to better understand the proposed model and benefits it will bring to Volunteer Marine Rescue. We all will learn something from this.





Two Rocks kindly brought "Neptune" down and this was gone over by the delegates and discussions went on into the night regarding some of the features of the vessel.





We all knew that Neptune was a sensational vessel and so did Queensland's VMR as they were over here and checked out the vessel much more closely this time taking many more notes and pictures.

Their comment was that we were right, and they are looking at the specifications and will consider it a definite option when they get home and discuss it further. Well done Joe Cordina.
